



# Background on Korean Sex Culture

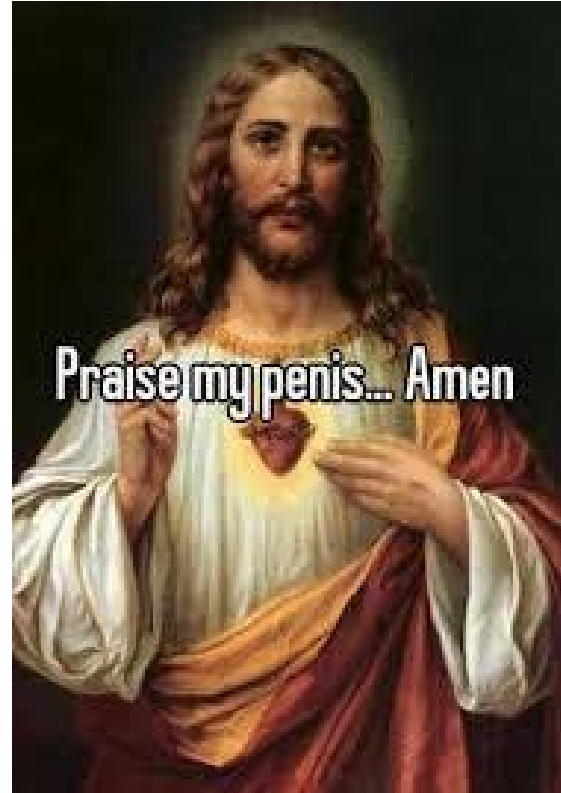
- Sterilization Program worked too well
