Dr. Jerome E. Granato has actively practiced clinical and interventional cardiology for over 20 years. His career has encompassed basic and clinical research, medical education, clinical practice and hospital administration. In 1975, Dr. Granato graduated with high honors from the Stevens Institute of Technology with a degree in chemical engineering. He attended the Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine, receiving the MD degree in 1979, followed by a 3-year residency in Internal Medicine at the Johns Hopkins Hospital. Dr. Granato pursued a fellowship in Cardiovascular Disease at the University of Virginia in Charlottesville, Virginia, remaining there an additional year as a research fellow of the American Heart Association. He is board certified in Internal Medicine, Cardiovascular Disease and Interventional Cardiology. He is a Fellow of the American College of Cardiology and a Fellow of the Council on Clinical Cardiology of the American Heart Association. In 2000, Dr. Granato received a Master of Business Administration degree from the J.L. Kellogg School of Graduate Management at Northwestern University.

Dr. Granato became Vice President and medical director for the National Cardiovascular Service Line at Catholic Health Initiatives in 2013. In this national position, he coordinates cardiovascular services in twelve health systems across the country, including three medical schools.
