

SUPPORT: Undergraduate interns receive free housing, \$1,050 for meals, travel reimbursement, and \$5,250 stipend over 10 weeks. High school interns will receive a \$2,800 stipend over 7 weeks.

ELIGIBILITY: Undergraduate applicants must be (1) US citizens or permanent residents. (2) enrolled in a college/university and not graduated by June 3, 2019, and (3) at least 18 years of age by June 3, 2019.

High school applicants do not have to be US citizens or permanent residents, but must be living locally during their internship (within a daily commute of Ithaca). High School students are not eligible for housing, travel, or meal allowance.

SUMMER ACADEMIC ENRICHMENT PROGRAM









SAEP is an intensive, six-week inter-professional academic enrichment program located on the VCU Health Campus in Richmond, Va. Designed to prepare college junior and senior undergraduate and post-baccalaureate students for admission into health professional programs, SAEP provides an academically rigorous experience that simulates the first year of health professional school.







APPLICATION OPENS: OCTOBER 15TH APPLICATION CLOSES: FEBRUARY 1ST PROGRAM DATES: LATE MAY - LATE JUNE

Students choose a concentration from only one of four disciplines to participate in on their application: Dentistry, Medicine, Pharmacy and Physical Therapy.

Requirements for admission to the program include:

- Three complete years of college coursework
- Organic chemistry I and II (Note: Not required for Physical Therapy track) - Cumulative GPA of 2.75
- Two letters of reference
- SAT/ACT Scores
- Official Transcript(s)
- Strong interest in attending health professions school at VCU











ALLIED HEALTH CAREER EXPLORATION

Allied Health Career Exploration is a two-week, non-residential summer program designed to expose high school seniors. college freshmen, sophomores, and juniors to the diverse professional programs available at the VCU College of Health


