Gender and Race in Healthcare

Medical racism or racial discrimination in healthcare, is considered a public health emergency. Black women are particularly at risk: maternal health statistics are dismal, Black women are more likely than white women to die of cancer, stroke, and heart attack, and Black Americans are disproportionately dying of COVID.
